Purpose of Training

The purpose of the training is to provide underpinning knowledge and skills to Managers / Supervisors and Staff to help them understand the implications of cultural differences in the workplace, in an effort to improve cohesion between new migrants and their host communities.

Who Should Attend

All staff who work in a multicultural environment, whether they are themselves of non-UK origin or work with colleagues or service users of non-UK origin.

Learning Outcomes

- Increased awareness of how different cultures perceive each other;
- Greater understanding of how culture influences people's attitudes, behaviour and communication styles;
- Better knowledge of how to adapt behaviour and communication styles in order to communicate with and work with care workers or service users from other cultural and linguistic backgrounds more effectively;
- Greater ability to handle cultural clashes and misunderstandings between residents and care workers or colleagues from other cultural and linguistic backgrounds;
- Increased awareness of key language issues when working with people whose native language is not English or not their own.
